TOWN MANAGER TRANSITION


Assistant Town Manager Christina Prince Burke was appointed as the Town's new Town Manager, effective August 30, 2025, after serving as the Acting Town Manager since July 1, 2025. Ms. Burke has served the Town in several capacities, including Water Clerk, Town Clerk, and most recently, Assistant Town Manager. She has been with the Town since 2009 and has previously worked at both Surf City and North Topsail Beach. She brings an extensive and impressive background in beach town administrative management and close relationships with the staff and residents.



CHANNEL SURVEY

Our coastal engineers, TI Coastal, conduct quarterly Conditional Surveys of Topsail Inlet & Banks Channel. Updated surveys are added to the Town Website once they are received.

TOPSAIL ISLAND VITEX ERADICATION PROJECT



Topsail Island beaches have joined together in the fight to eradicate vitex. The Towns applied for state funding to implement the Topsail Island Vitex Eradication Project. On June 19, 2024, the NCDEQ Water Resources Commission awarded Topsail Island a grant in the amount of \$690,060.50 to continue our work on mitigation of the existing vitex.

In August 2025, Michael Baker Engineering began surveying properties to establish initial treatment on vitex areas. An interactive map and a written permission form can be found on the <u>TISPC website</u>.

Please note that properties that were initially identified in survey conducted in early 2024 are being treated during this current phase. The Town hopes additional funding can be obtained to continue this four-to-five year long project.

Finances

8¢ rate increase for FY 25/26 (7.5¢ going toward to the BIS Fund)

The Board recognizes the vital role that our beach, inlet, and sound have as a recreational, environmental, and economic engine for our community. A goal for this Board has been to replenish the BIS fund for future nourishment projects as costs continue to grow. The Board has also focused on the Capital Improvement needs for the Town. The CIP Fund was created in FY 23/24 to offset some of these costs.

DECISIONS AND MOVING FORWARD

September 2 & 4, 2025 Special Meetings

After holding an informational Special Meeting on September 2 to provide an in-depth overview of the progress of the Public Safety Building, the Board voted on September 4 to approve the final floor plan/design, which included a fourth bay for the Fire Station and an increase in the \$9 million initial budget, approved during the May 15, 2025 Regular Town Board Meeting, to \$9.6 million with the fourth fire bay to add future optionality and cupolas, a metal roof over the admin area to match the fire bays, and an enclosed parking level for enhanced architectural interest. Interest earned on the grant and funds on hand will cover the increase and there will be no increase in taxes for this.

We encourage everyone to review the videos of the presentation, the discussion, and the subsequent vote in the meetings on the Town Website's **Agendas and Minutes page**.

The Public Safety Building Team has continued meeting and recently discussed design aspects relating to functionality and communication needs. Permitting and a public bid for subcontractors is the next hurdle in the process, followed closely by the start of construction.

<u>Hurricane season is not over yet! What to Do Before a Tropical Storm or Hurricane arrives.</u>

It is vital to understand your home's vulnerability to storm surge, flooding, and wind. Here is your checklist of things to do for hurricane season:

- Develop an evacuation plan and Know Your Zone.
- <u>Assemble Disaster Supplies</u>. Check emergency equipment, such as flashlights, generators and storm shutters.
- <u>Create a communication plan</u>. Take the time now to write down your hurricane plan, and share it with your family. Determine family meeting places, and make sure to include an out-of-town location in case of evacuation. Write down on paper a list of emergency contacts, and make sure to include utilities and other critical services remember, the internet may not be accessible during or after a storm.
- <u>Strengthen Your Home</u>.
- Review Your Insurance Policies: Review your insurance policies to ensure that you have adequate coverage for your home and personal property.
- Understand NWS forecast products, especially the meaning of <u>NWS watches</u> and warnings.

Remember you should prepare EACH and EVERY YEAR, as it only takes ONE Storm! Visit NOAA's National Hurricane Preparedness <u>website</u> to better understand your risk and begin season preparations.
