## FY 23-24 BUDGET PUBLIC HEARING

The proposed FY 23-24 budget for the Town of Topsail Beach has been submitted to the Mayor and Board of Commissioners. A copy of the proposed budget is available for public inspection in the office of the Deputy Town Clerk at the Topsail Beach Town Hall, 820 S. Anderson Blvd., Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM.

A public hearing on the proposed budget will be held on Wednesday, June 14, 2023, at 6:00 PM at the Topsail Beach Town Hall, 820 S. Anderson Blvd., Topsail Beach, NC, 28445.

All interested parties are encouraged to attend. Oral comments will be received from any interested citizens at the Public Hearing.



### **MANDATORY WATERING SCHEDULE**

The Following watering schedule is for irrigation systems that are connected to the Town water system and is in effect from May 27 – September 30 each year.

- All property owners NORTH OF DAVIS AVE can irrigate during the hours of 2 A.M. and 4 A.M. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday only.
- All property owners SOUTH OF DAVIS AVE can irrigate during the hours of 2 A.M. and 4 A.M. on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday only.

All in-ground irrigation systems using Town water must have rainfall cut off sensors installed, or must be manually shut off to prevent watering during active rainfall within any assigned irrigation time and day.

Manual Watering with Town water for owners without in-ground irrigation systems is restricted to two (2) hours per day using the same addressing system described above. Any manual watering must take place between the hours of 5 A.M. and 10 A.M. during these assigned days.

It is recognized that many homeowners without irrigation systems are unable to water during the week because they are only here on weekends. Thus, manual watering for two (2) hours on Saturday or Sunday is permitted between the hours of 5 A.M. and 10 A.M.

There will be NO watering for the period between July 2-8.

#### Household Trash:

Regular household trash pick-up occurs on Monday mornings.

Beginning the week of Memorial Day and lasting through Labor Day, household trash will be picked up on Monday and Thursday mornings.

#### Bulk Item Pick-Up Schedule:

- First Friday of Every Month
- First and Third Friday during June August

#### Instructions for Homeowners:

Vegetative debris and large household goods will be collected during Bulk Item Pick-Up. This includes electronics and e-waste, appliances, furniture, mattresses, and yard waste.

Vegetative debris must be in 4-foot sections or less to be collected. **Vegetative debris** <u>should not</u> be bagged but piled near the edge of the street. Please remember vegetative debris pick-up is designed for lawn clippings, leaves and trimmings of trees and shrubs, not for large or contracted projects.

Bulk Items such as furniture, mattresses (limit ONE mattress set (2 pieces) per household), and appliances\* are included in the bulk item pick up.

\*appliances with a door (refrigerator, stove, dishwasher etc.) must be taped shut.

Construction debris and material <u>WILL NOT</u> be picked up in bulk item collection. This includes lumber, treated or painted, etc.; pilings, decking and walkways; any material from new construction, remodeling or replacement/repairs; concrete cinder blocks and bricks; carpet, tires, sinks, toilets and doors. DRY paint cans will be picked up.

Construction Debris can be taken to the Transfer Station in Pender County. You can contact them at 910-270-5011 to find out what items they accept and their rates.

**Recycling Center:** All Recyclables (glass, plastic, and paper) can be brought to the recycling center located in the front parking lot of the Assembly Building.

## TB RECYCLING CENTER

All Recyclables (glass, plastic and paper) can be brought to the recycling center located in the front parking lot of the Assembly Building. These are bulk recycling bins that have the Town logo on them in which all recyclable material can be placed. The dumpster located next to the Assembly Building is for their private use and is NOT for recycling or public use:

- 1. Remove lids and caps and crush your plastic soft drink bottles by stepping on them. You'll be saving space in our containers allowing us to operate more efficiently.
- 2.All glass containers may be recycled. Please rinse them out and remove the metal lids.
- 3. Newspaper and all of the inserts can be recycled. To maximize the amount the bin can hold, you can tie them together with string.

As a reminder: NO Styrofoam is permitted in the recycling dumpsters. Keeping unpermitted materials out of the recycling dumpsters, such as Styrofoam and regular household trash, will keep these loads free of contaminants.
